A Dream Come True



After two years of continuing to postpone the boat building course it is officially underway. The course runs 8 days, Sunday to Sunday. We welcome our new Shipwright Mark Reuten. Mark is a master shipwright and owns Nomad Boatbuilding based out of Victoria, BC.










Polliwog Build - The Method

The Stitch and Glue method uses wire sutures to hold panels together until they can be joined permanently with epoxy and fiberglass tape. The outside of the hull is completely coated with fiberglass or Dynel cloth sheathing. All exposed wood is coated with epoxy to encapsulate the boat from sun and sea to retain the excellent characteristics of wooden boats without the drawbacks of traditional building methods. Finally, the boat can be finished with high quality marine paint to finish the whole project in a mirror sheen. For small boats, the Stitch and Glue method can be built on a pair of sawhorses in one bay of a household garage. For larger boats, the construction mold is designed into the actual boat. The parts that ensure you build a straight and fair boat are the same parts that become permanent elements of the unified structure, yielding an exceptionally strong and long lasting result.






The Cowichan Bay Maritime Centre's Pier has been enjoyed by the community and visitors alike for many years. Although the Maritime Centre including the new oceanfront Patio Portal remains open, the beautiful long pier that leads out over the ocean was unfortunately closed to the public, when engineers determined that the 97-year old pilings that support the heritage pier needed rehabilitation. The Directors and Staff have started a fundraiser "The Pile Drive" in order to raise funds to get the pier rehabilitated for the community to enjoy for many years to come. The Heritage Pier promotes the area's maritime history and is an important tourist attraction. The structure hosts many Cowichan area celebrations, meetings, maritime recreation and educational presentations for groups and individuals including our Annual Wooden Boat Festival, North America's first "Cittaslow" community and the Cowichan Valley Dragon Divas dragon boat team. In 2015, the Cowichan Valley Regional District added the Cowichan Bay Maritime Centre's pier to its heritage registry. In three years the Heritage Pier will be 100 years old. President's Report



Happy 2022 to everyone.

What 2020 and 2021 have taught me is that the CWBS chugs along in spite of what nature throws at us. General fund raising has been severely affected by covid. Restrictions have curtailed large events and limited visitors. We gladly accept donations and items for future garage sales

In 2025 our beloved pier will celebrate its 100th Anniversary and our Society its 37th. In preparation for that event and others leading up to it we are launching the "The Pile Drive" a multi-pronged fund raising initiative to rehabilitate our Heritage Pier. This is not a new project. We have been working on our pier structural plans a number of years now. In 2018 we secured funding to add steel piling under the Pavilion and thereby stabilize the entire pier. We expect to hear shortly from our major grant applications whose funding will allow us to replace our tired creosote wooden pilings with steel ones.

The workshop has been busy with personal new boat builds and restorations. Our woodworking courses and clinker boat building course taught by Mark Reuten have recently managed to run smoothly even under covid protocols. Just goes to show that with good planning, attention to details and cooperative people we can pull off any project.

Our newly opened Patio Portal promises to be a visual link to the water and a meeting place for individuals and public area for special events. We welcome your ideas.

The Board of Directors has launched a Questionnaire for our Society members and the Cowichan community. The gist of our questions is quite simple:

"What does our membership and the surrounding community want to find at the Maritime Centre that isn't available now?"

I am hoping that many people of all ages will take the time to answer our questions and add their own personal thoughts.
